The German cinema of the Weimar Republic (1918–1933), and especially the silent films and early talkies of the era, played a vital role in the visual arts of the 20th century. Movies like *The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari*, *Nosferatu*, *The Golem*, *Metropolis*, *Pandora's Box*, *The Blue Angel*, and *M* long set the international standard of cinematic modes of expression with their powerful imagery.

His observations and the plethora of images transform this book into an encyclopedia and movie guide that visually reveals to the reader the innovativeness and great star potential of German cinema of the time.

What were once lobby photos for advertising purposes are now, years later, museum pieces. We have printed this precious pictorial material in exceptionally high quality, making this book a feast for the eyes that will appeal to a broad audience.
